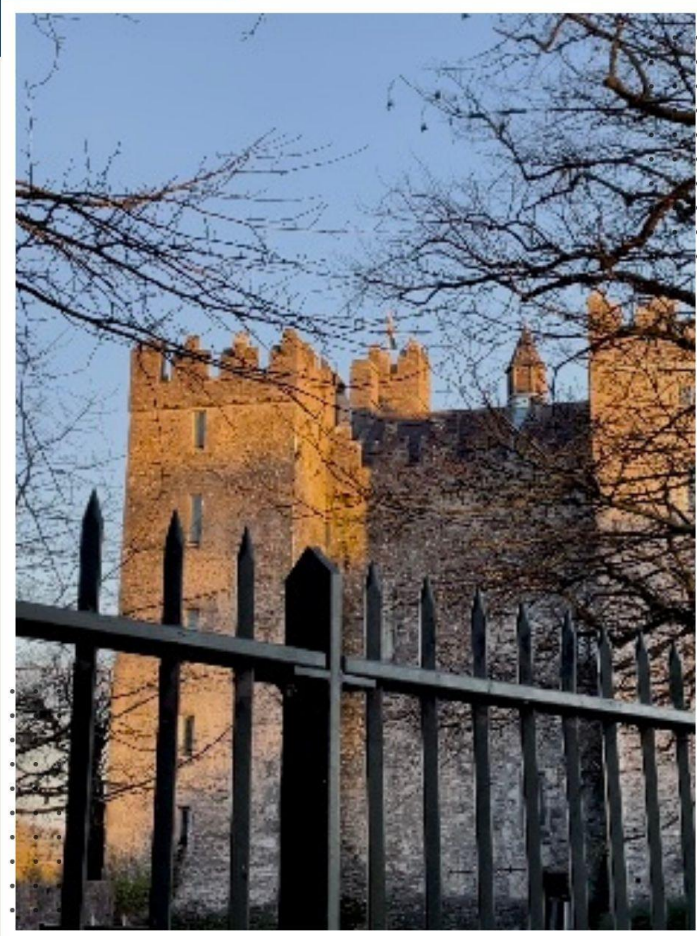

RESTORATION

1250

The first Bunratty Castle was a wooden structure built on high ground by the Norman adventurer, Robert de Muscegros (near the site now occupied by the Shannon Shamrock Hotel). By the end of the century, a town of about 1,000 people had developed.

1275

In the late 13th century, the lands were granted by King Edward I to Thomas de Clare who built the first stone castle on the present site.

1450

The present stone castle was built by the MacNamara Family in the middle of 15th century and later taken over by the O'Briens. This castle was attacked and ruined during the Cromwellian and Williamite wars by 1700 it lay deserted.





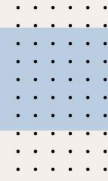

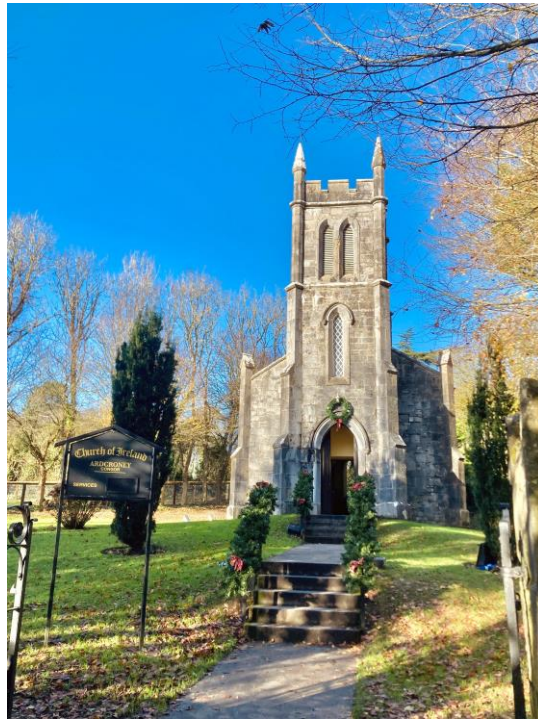
